


MAURITIUS THE 10 BEST VILLAS TO RENT









This beautiful island is proliferated h the weekend homes of Franco-Mauritians who live in north or the highlands during the week and decamp on kends and holidays to the west and east coasts. A drive along any of the island's coastal roads will reveal these nes behind high walls and down long, gated driveways. Ranging from simple, three-bedroom 'shacks' in prime eachfront positions to luxurious villas with fleets of staff d rim-flow pools - we've compiled a list of villas across range of price, position, taste, activity and luxe levels to ensure there is a rental to suit every taste and need.



VILLA L'ILOT/ISLAND VILLA (EAST COAST)

This incredible wood-and-stone house sits on its own island and is reachable only by a private narrow causeway road. The design of the house makes full use of its wraparound sea views with a deep, covered verandah that runs the width of the house and looks out onto the coral reef beyond it. There are three double rooms (two en-suite) with a fourth room that can sleep up to three kids in bunk beds and a baby bed, plus a communal bathroom. You'll find it hard to leave L'Ilot with its instant access to warm water, coral reefs and azure water.

Closest town Rivier du Rempart.

Sleeps Nine, plus a baby.

Child-friendly? Yes, but as the house is surrounded by water, parental supervision at all times is strongly advised.

Activities Kite surfing and diving.

Negatives The prohibitive price.
